Mr. Gilfillan worked closely with the FBI's cyber and white collar crime squads, cyber-crime agents with the Secret Service, and numerous other federal law enforcement agencies. He also worked closely with the SEC

and other civil regulatory authorities in prosecutions involving parallel criminal and civil investigations and litigation. Mr. Gilfillan also has significant experience consulting with companies and third parties regarding cyber legal issues and investigations.
