Andrew Saul focuses his practice on patent infringement litigation. Andrew is experienced trying cases in the U.S. District Courts, the International Trade Commission, and the Patent Trial and Appeal Board. Recently, Andrew tried a case in the U.S. District Court for the District of Delaware for an American technology company accused of infringement, in which the jury returned a complete defense verdict of non-infringement and invalidity of all asserted patent claims. Andrew also recently tried a case in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Texas, in which he successfully argued a motion for judgment as a matter of law of non-infringement. Andrew also has a substantial appellate practice. Recently, he was successful in the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit for a marine engine manufacturer, obtaining vacatur of a decision by the Patent Trial and Appeal Board invalidating patent claims.

Andrew holds a degree in Electrical Engineering, with Highest Honors, from the Georgia Institute of Technology. Andrew leverages this background to assist his clients in cases involving a variety of technologies, including semiconductors, supercomputers, wireless communications, data encryption, image processing, and mechanical systems. Andrew represents clients through all stages of litigation, including through trial.

Andrew joined the firm in 2016 after working for the firm as a Summer Associate. During law school, he served as an Articles Editor for the *Georgia Law Review*, worked as a legal intern at the UGA Technology Commercialization Office, and was Vice President of the UGA Intellectual Property Law Society. He also served as the student representative to the American Intellectual Property Law Association and was nominated by his professors as a Pupil in the Atlanta Intellectual Property Inn of Court.

Prior to joining the legal profession, Andrew was a technology consultant, performing software development and data analysis for several U.S. and international telecommunications companies.
