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Daily fantasy sports (DFS) has rapidly become a \$26 billion industry with nearly 60 million players annually. It involves pretending to be the general manager of an imaginary team in an imaginary league but competing based on the actual production of real players. Typically, traditional fantasy sports are played over the course of an entire season with winners earning some type of predetermined prize, usually collected from entry fees. The primary difference with DFS is the rapidly accelerated period of competition, which is often a single day or week.
