He frequently travels to the USPTO and its various satellite offices to meet with patent examiners to expedite the patent process for his clients, effectively obtaining patents at a lower cost by decreasing the number of rounds of patent prosecution necessary to receive an issued patent.

Currently, Karam is focused on artificial intelligence (AI), autonomous driving systems, home automation products, battery technology, satellite-based data distribution systems, electronic control systems, and cloud-computing applications.

Prior to joining the legal profession, Karam was an electrical engineer at BAE Systems where he designed and developed hardware and software for military production programs.

In January 2019, Karam won *Denver Business Journal's* 40 and 40 award for his professional and pro bono legal work. He was named a top patent practitioner in 2024, 2025 and 2026 by *IAM Patent 1000 – The World's Leading Patent Practitioners*. Karam has also been recognized as a 2017-2020 Colorado "Rising Star" in the area of intellectual property by *Super Lawyers* magazine and was featured in a 2019 *Super Lawyers* article for his pro bono work reuniting children with their families. He was recommended by *Legal 500 US* in 2023 for Patent Prosecution. Karam also does significant pro bono work. Recently, he has been focused on helping low income families complete adoptions and helping long-time residents file for Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) to legally allow for U.S. work authorization and deferment of any removal action from the United States.
