## You Stole My Invention! Authorship and Inventorship Considerations in Honoring Non-Disclosure Agreements, Chapter 5

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The similarities and differences between authorship and inventorship are subtle, often leading to difficulties in deciding who should be designated an author on a work of authorship or an inventor on a patent application. In addition, obligations created by non-disclosure agreements (NDAs) can impact these important decisions as well as the timing of public disclosures and patent filings.
