Legal and Ethical Implications of Athletes' Biometric Data in Professional Sport

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"Big data" has existed in some form for decades, but it has finally arrived in the public's consciousness in a proportionately "big" way. This new awareness of big data is partially attributed to an exponential increase in the volume of data collection, and partially to the nature of how it is stored and accessed—primarily on cloud servers, in addition to or as a substitute for traditional servers.
